FRIENDZY SEL PROGRAM

This month we move on to the second unit in our social and emotional literacy program:



In this unit, students will be reminded that God's Word calls us to show love all the time, not just when it is easy or convenient. Students will be challenged and equipped with the tools to show compassion and kindness in various circumstances they might encounter each day. We encourage parents to continue the conversation at home by asking students to share what they are learning.

Research shows that social and emotional literacy supports success in every part of a student's life, with positive gains in both academic achievement and interpersonal relationships.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FROM THE NURSE

Absence Calls: Parents must call the school nurse before 8:00am to report any absence (use option 3 on the automated menu). Please give your name and your relation to the student, the student's name, homeroom, and the reason for the absence.

If your child is ill, please report the nature of the illness. Please follow these guidelines to protect your child and the rest of the school community from illness:

- Be sure that your child is eating healthy foods and getting plenty of exercise and sleep
- Frequent hand washing for everyone at home
- Get a flu shot (now is the best time)
- Change out school masks daily (ensure a second clean mask is always in your child's backpack)
- Please remain vigilant in monitoring your child's health and wellness every day. Take your child's temperature every morning before leaving for school and assesses their general health daily. Please keep children home if they have a temperature and/or any complaint of illness and contact your child's health care provider for advice on:
 - * Fever, cough, or sore throat
 - Complaints of feeling ill
 - * Diarrhea or vomiting must wait at least 24 hours after vomiting/diarrhea ends before returning to school
 - * Rash of unknown origin
 - * Eye conjunctivitis (pink eye)
- Send your child back to school only when they have been cleared by a general practice doctor or physician's assistant AND are:
 - * Fever free for 24 hours AND not using analgesics for temperatures
 - * If on antibiotics, at least 24 hours after first dose and feeling better

Students are REQUIRED to remain at home if:

- They test positive for COVID-19 or have been exposed to/in contact with someone who has tested positive. If this happens the parent/guardian needs to inform the Saint James School nurse immediately. If a positive test result is received after 3:00pm or over the weekend, please email Mrs. Zorger immediately at bzorger@saintjamesschool.net.
- Your child is involved with an activity where there has been a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19, and you have been told your child needs to quarantine. Exposed individuals can still spread the virus even though they may not be experiencing any symptoms.
- If a student has traveled to any of the current CT DPH COVID-19 hotspots, he/she will need to quarantine for 14 days prior to returning to school.
- They experience any high risk COVID-19 symptoms including:
 - * Fever (above 100.0 F or per clinical judgement with OR without fatigue/body aches/chills)
 - * New unexplained loss of taste or smell
 - Respiratory symptoms (lung congestion, shortness of breath)
